Hammond Is Seated In State Senate But It's Unofficial

Senator-elect Chauncey B. Hammond Wednesday occupied the State Senate seat of his predecessor, the late C. Tracey Stagg, although he has yet to take the official oath of office.

Hammond Wins State Senate Seat By 18,412

Chauncey B. Hammond's plurality over W. Harry McConnell for State Senator in the four counties of the 41st District was 18,412, final returns showed today. The vote: Hammond, Republican, 34,992; McConnell, Democrat-ALP,

The total vote, 51,572, was 8,047 under the total cast last year in the State Senatorial contest between the late C. Tracey Stagg and William D. Young. Last year Stagg defeated Young by a 19,926 plurality. The percentage of the total vote polled by Hammond and Stagg was the same, about 66 per cent.
